

THE KINCAID FAMILY

Each number indicates a generation, starting with "1" in 1064; thus, "2" is the son of "1"; "3" is the grandson of "1" and the son of "2", etc. Where there are several persons listed in the same generation, they are given the designation of A, B, C, etc.. Thus 5A is Alwyn II, son of 4, Alwyn. 5B is Eth, son of Alwyn, 4, and the brother of 5A.

Please note that surnames were not used in this early period. A person was known by his Christian name, and if an artisan, by his trade or clan. Sometimes his Christian name was followed by the name of his father preceded by Mac or O'--meaning "son of". In the case of landed gentry, families were known by the name of their property. The first mention of KINCAID which has been found was in the year 1238, when the lands of KYNCAITH were granted to William Galbraith. The owner of the KINCAID lands became the LAIRD OF KINCAID. The eldest son of the family was KINCAID, younger, OF-THAT-ILK The younger sons were spoken of as, e.g., John Kincaid in, not of KINCAID.

By secret path up cliff on a dark night Francis led a band of men who surprised the English garrison and captured the castle. Was knighted--allowed to wear on his arms a triple towered castle and given hereditary constableness of Edinburgh--retained by the family for many generations. THERE IS NOW A GAP IN THE RECORDS OF OVER A HUNDRED YEARS. Many of the KINCAID family papers were destroyed by a fire at Cannerton House, where they had been stored while tradesmen were in possession of KINCAID HOUSE, engaged in building the new mansion. From Robert, C-1, to Alexander, 0-1, I have been obliged to secure my information as to the lineage from the court records at Edinburgh, and from the Parish of Campsie. This is necessarily an incomplete method, especially as to names of all issue, and dates of births and deaths. There can be no doubt, however, of the actual line of ancestry back to Robert, 0-1, who was Laird in 1448.

(In the following information, successive generations are indicated to successive letters of the alphabet. Individuals within a generation are identified by a number after the letter.. The series of identifying letters and numbers after each name traces his ancestors from person to person back to Robert, C-1. The date, when given, indicates the time of the documentation found by the researcher and thus the date the person lived.

All this took place within a few miles of KINCAID and the family retainers soon learned of the capture. The wives of the two married brothers, Samuel, P-30, and George, P-11, were taken to Glasgow with some of their furniture and the four brothers, Samuel, P-30; George, P-11; James, P-31; Robert, P-32, were spirited out of the English camp, and all of them put on board ship. - O-6 David Kincaid. Took part in the unsuccessful Stuart rebellion in 1715, and was in consequence obliged to leave Scotland. His wife and three children were captured by the Indians. Ft. Mann at the mouth of Falling Springs Creek was garrisoned by the Kincaids, Mc- Allisters, McCrearys and Barrys. Court records--deeds, wills, etc. and the Fayette County, Pennsylvania history, show that Samuel Kinkade was living there 1763 to about 1783 at Wilson's Port on the Monongahela River, where he had a ferry and where he also taught school. In 1783 (According to "Old Kentucky Entries and Deeds") he turned up in Kentucky; entering lands in several counties. The Court Records of Livingstone County show the marriage of a daughter Jane, to Aeneas McAllister and his daughter Ailsa, married to Joseph Miller, was also living there.- Land sales on record in Fayette County, Penn., indicate the approximate date of his departure for Kentucky. With his sons George Wilson, William (the famous Campbellite minister, Hugh, and his widowed daughter Ailsa Miller, he moved to Lawrence County, Illinois in 1819, where he died in 1834 at 87. Build a large hotel and summer cottages. One of the most prominent citizens of Greenbrier. Served on Grand jury May, 1781. In 1792 was commissioned justice for Greenbrier County.
